

Uniform Info

Parents help keep the new uniforms looking new. Please make sure your child has a garment bag for protecting the uniforms on all band trips.

Laundering the band uniform Bibbers:

Do Not Dry Clean!

Always wash whites with whites and darks with dark colors.

NEVER wash these in HOT water! NEVER use liquid fabric softener on the band uniforms!

If a softener sheet is required, use only one sheet per load.

Use only NON-CHLORINE detergent!

We recommend Woolite dark laundry fabric wash for Blacks. Machine wash in cold on the gentle / knit cycle, do *NOT* overload machine. *Do NOT use a hot dryer setting!* Use a cool setting. When dried on a cool setting, uniforms will require very little touch up. Remove them from the dryer and place on a hanger immediately. Touch up pressing on pants to make sure there is a nice crease in them with a cloth between the iron and pants.

It is important to remove a stain as soon as possible.

If a stain occurs, sponge/blot with water or treat with an appropriate product before it has time to set and before laundering. *DO NOT RUB.* You may use "Spray and Wash" and other NON-Chlorine stain removers when washing. Use only *NON-Chlorine* detergent.

Laundering the Color Guard Uniforms:

Always wash like colors together. Do Not Dry Clean! NEVER wash these in HOT water! Use only NON-CHLORINE detergent!

We recommend Woolite dark laundry fabric wash for Blacks.

Do not overload the washer or dryer.

Towel dry first by placing a towel on the inside and outside of the garment. Press with your hands to take out the excess water. FLUFF dry the garment on a cool setting for a few minutes and then hang to complete the drying process.
